Teaching a Song: Considerations and Guidelines

PREPARING TO TEACH A SONG

ANALYSIS

- *Aesthetic* (appeal to children; personal ownership!!)
- *Musical*: length, form, lyrics, key/mode, range & tessitura, ideas about music
- **Pedagogical** scope for activities, curricular balance; social and cultural relevance; Social-emotional appropriateness

APPROACH/METHOD

• Rote, rote-note, note, and combinations

LESSON PLAN OUTLINE

• Front matter

- Basic info, resources, standards
- Lesson Objectives/engagement (what will students know and be able to do)

• Procedure

- *Prepare* (typically high energy)
- Present (focused, skills based, guided new learning)
- Practice & Extend
- Assess learning & Close (ongoing and summative; coming home to a new place ...)

SONG LESSON PREPARATION THINKING AHEAD

- *Musical* (beat, tempo, starting pitch, accompaniment and dynamic level, lead in [1, ready, sing] and ending)
- *Pedagogical* (motivate and engage, questions, guide practice, diagnose and remediate, check for learning)
- Communication (use of hands, facial expression, speaking voice, singing voice, taking answers, use of silence, energy levels, position in classroom, identifying students)

IN THE MOMENT... LOTS TO THINK ABOUT... MULTI-TASKING YOUR WAY THROUGH TEACHING A SONG!

- give students starting pitch and set tempo
- sing **whole song** first before breaking it down into phrases
- teach phrase by phrase
- give **feedback**
- ask questions
- use appropriate language
- give simple and clear directions
- use varied facial expression and body language
- make **big motions** for little people!
- be aware of the **envelope of space** you're using (where did I stand; did I walk around, did I look at everyone, who caught my attention, how did I move)
